Petitioner is praying for regular bail in case FIR No.149, dated 21.08.2023, registered under Sections 25 of Act No. 54 of 1959 i.e. the Arms Act, 1959, at Police Station Mataur, District SAS Nagar.

As per the allegations, during a naka laid by police party on 21.08.2023, a pistol country made 32 bore was recovered from the possession of the petitioner, which was unloaded and checked and from the magazine three bullets were recovered.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that petitioner has been falsely implicated. Learned counsel further contends that petitioner is in custody for the last more than 02 months, with no criminal antecedent; and that the trial is likely to take long time to conclude.

Learned State counsel does not dispute the fact that petitioner has no criminal antecedent.

A perusal of the custody certificate reveals that the petitioner is in custody for the last 02 months and 19 days, with no criminal antecedent. The trial will take long time to conclude.

Considering all the aforesaid facts and circumstances of the case, but without commenting anything on the merits of the case, the petitioner is admitted to bail. He is ordered to be released on bail on his furnishing requisite bail bonds and surety bonds to the satisfaction of learned Trial Court/Duty Magistrate concerned.
