1. The present petition has been filed under Section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure with a prayer to issue appropriate directions to respondents No.1 to 3 to get the FIR No.166 dated 27.05.2023, under Sections 302, 328, 404 and 201 of Indian Penal Code, 1860 investigated in a fair and impartial manner.

2. Status report by way of an affidavit of Assistant Superintendent of Police, Ambala has been filed on behalf of the respondents No.1 to 5 and the same is taken on record.

3. Learned State counsel submits that after the registration of the case, the investigation of the case has been carried out and the police had

collected the CDR of mobile number 8607773377 of Sukhchain Singh, the missing person. After the receipt of the dead body of Sukhchain Singh, the proceedings under Section 174 of Cr.P.C. were conducted. After the PMR, the dead body was handed over to the relatives of the deceased. He further submits that in the present case, the Cyber Cell, Ambala has collected the dumps of the mobile phone of the area, where dead body was found. Even it was found that various amounts were withdrawn from the account of the wife of the deceased, by Sukhchain Singh. Learned State counsel further submits that the investigation in the present case was completed and the final report under Section 173 Cr.P.C. was submitted in the Court. Now charges under this case have been framed on 19.10.2023 and the trial of the case is fixed for 15.01.2024 for prosecution evidence.

3. At this stage, when the case is listed for prosecution evidence, no further orders are required. However, the petitioner shall be at liberty to avail his alternative remedies in accordance with law.

4. With these observations, the present petition is disposed off.
