1. The counsel for the petitioner(s) submits that the petitioner filed suit for declaration and permanent injunction with regard to suit property, in which notice was issued to respondents No.1 and 2; and they appeared before the trial Court and made statement admitting the claim of the petitioner and other plaintiffs and pleaded no objection if the suit is decreed as is evident from order dated 9.5.2022 (Annexure P-3). The counsel further submits that despite the aforesaid admission made by the defendants, the learned trial Court failed to pass the final decree on the basis of admission made by defendants, as per provisions under Order 12 Rule 6 CPC and now the suit is fixed for

24.11.2023, for consideration. The counsel for the petitioner further submits that the petitioner will be satisfied if necessary directions are given to the trial Court to finally decide the suit, as per law, in a time bound manner.

2. In the light above, without commenting on the merits of the case, the present petition is disposed of with direction to the trial Court to decide the suit filed by the petitioner, in accordance with law, in an expeditious manner without granting unnecessary adjournments and preferably within a period of next 3 months of receipt of certified copy of this order.
