1. The petitioner had filed a Revision Petition against the order dated 03.06.2022 passed by the Debts Recovery Tribunal-I, Chandigarh and an interim order was passed on 17.08.2022 by this Court in CR-2475-2022 staying the operation of the order dated 03.06.2022, whereafter the Tribunal proceeded further and passed the final order on 09.01.2023.

2. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the Tribunal could not have passed the final order in view of the interim order passed by this Court. It is also informed that the order passed by the Tribunal was again challenged before this Court and was also dismissed by this Court on 11.09.2023 in CWP-19819-2023.

3. The petitioners submit that the Tribunal could not have passed the final order and therefore, it has committed the contempt of this Court.

4. I have considered the submissions of the learned counsel for the petitioner.

5. This Court finds that vide interim order dated 17.08.2022, this Court only restrained the Tribunal from implementation of its impugned order dated 03.06.2022 and did not stop the Tribunal from passing the final order. Further, the final order has also been upheld by this Court. In view thereof, no case for contempt is made out and the same is dismissed accordingly.

6. All pending applications filed in this Contempt Petition shall stand disposed of.
