N.S. SHEKHAWAT, J.

1. After arguing the matter at length, learned counsel for the petitioner wishes to withdraw the present petition with liberty to the petitioner to raise all the pleas available to her during the course of trial at an appropriate stage.

2. Dismissed as withdrawn with liberty aforesaid.

3. At this stage, learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner is aged about 76 years and is suffering from old age related diseases. Moreover, the petitioner is a resident of Ludhiana and the present case has been wrongly registered against her at Gurugram. Consequently, learned counsel prays that the petitioner may be granted exemption from personal appearance, during the course of trial.

4. On an advance notice, Mr. Rajinder Kumar Banku, DAG, Haryana, has put in appearance on behalf of the respondent-State.

5. Heard.

6. The prayer made by the learned counsel for the petitioner is accepted.

7. The petitioner is granted exemption from personal appearance before the trial Court. However, the petitioner shall file an affidavit before the trial Court to the effect that she has no objection, in case the proceedings before the trial Court are recorded in her absence and in the presence of her counsel. The trial Court shall also be at liberty to call the petitioner as and when her presence is required at any stage of trial. The trial Court shall also be at liberty to impose such conditions, as it may deem fit in view of the peculiar facts and circumstances of the case.

9. Petition stands disposed of.
