Annexure P-4 and for exemption from filing certified copy
thereof.

For the reasons mentioned in the application, the
same is allowed subject to all just exceptions. Annexure P-
4 is taken on record. Exemption sought for is granted.

Prayer in the present petition is for grant of
anticipatory bail to the petitioner in FIR No.159, dated
06.12.2022 (Annexure P-1), under Sections 341, 332, 353,
186 and 506 of the IPC, registered at Police Station Nangal,
Tehsil Nangal, District Rupnagar, Punjab.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner was not initially named in the FIR but was roped in during the course of investigation. He further asserts that the injuries attributed to the petitioner are simple in nature Notice of motion.

On the asking of Court, Mr. Rajiv Verma, DAG, Punjab accepts notice on behalf of the respondent-State, who could not controvert the said fact.

Looking at the totality of facts and circumstances and also the fact that the injuries attributed to the petitioner are simple in nature, as such, the petitioner is directed to be released on interim bail subject to the satisfaction of Arresting Officer/Investigating Officer on his joining investigation as and when called for and cooperate in investigation and shall abide by the conditions as envisaged under Section 438 (2) Cr.P.C.

Adjourned to 03.07.2023.”

2. Today, learned State counsel, on instructions from ASI Gurnaib Singh, has stated that pursuant to the order dated 13.02.2023, the petitioner has joined investigation and is no longer required for custodial interrogation.
3. In view of above, the interim order dated 13.02.2023 passed by this Court is made absolute, subject to the conditions as enumerated under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.
4. Petition stands disposed off.
