On 23.01.2023, the following order was passed:-

“The prayer in the present petition filed under Section 438 Cr.P.C. is for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner in case bearing FIR No.02, dated 16.01.2022, under Sections 307, 34 of IPC and Sections 25, 27 of Arms Act, registered at Police Station Chohla Sahib, District Tarn Taran.

In compliance of order dated 23.12.2022, status report dated 21.01.2023 by way of an affidavit of Arun Sharma, PPS, Deputy Superintendent of Police, Sub Division Khadoor Sahib, Camp at Goindwal Sahib, District Tarn Taran on behalf of the respondent-State has been filed today in the Court and the same is taken on record. Copy thereof has been supplied to the counsel opposite.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that FIR was got registered on the wrong facts. There was delay of two days in lodging the FIR. The injury, if any, is attributed below the knee.

Learned counsel for the complainant states that now the parties have entered into an compromise that parties belong to the same village.

Adjourned to 12.04.2023.

Meanwhile, in the eventuality of arrest of the petitioner in the instant case, he shall be enlarged on interim bail subject to his furnishing personal bond/surety bond to the satisfaction of Investigating Officer/Arresting Officer. The petitioner shall join the investigation as and when called upon to do so by the Investigating Agency. The petitioner shall abide by the conditions as laid down under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C. in letter and spirit.”

Today, learned State counsel, on instructions from ASI Kulwinder Singh, has stated that pursuant to the order dated 23.01.2023, the petitioner has joined investigation and is no longer required for custodial interrogation.

In view of above, the interim order dated 23.01.2023 passed by this Court is made absolute, subject to the conditions as enumerated under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

This petition stands disposed off.
