The present petition has been filed under Section 482 Cr.P.C. for quashing of Rapat No.23 dated 06.03.2022 registered under Sections 326, 323, 506, 201 and 34 IPC in FIR No.21 dated 05.03.2022 registered under Sections 323, 324, 427, 506 and 34 IPC at Police Station Rangar Nangal, Police District Batala and all proceedings arising therefrom qua the petitioners on the basis of a compromise dated 30.11.2022 (Annexure P-3) entered into between the parties.

On 06.01.2023 this Court had directed the parties to appear before the Illaqa Magistrate/Trial Court for recording of their respective statements with regard to the compromise, who in turn was directed to submit a report along with the recorded statements with regard to the veracity of the compromise between the parties as also to apprise this Court whether all the accused are party to the compromise and whether any of them have ever been declared proclaimed offender(s).

As directed, report dated 27.03.2023 from the Sub Divisional Judicial Magistrate, Batala has been received as per which the parties had recorded their statements before the Trial Court in terms of the compromise arrived at between them; the same is genuine; all the petitioners/accused are party to the compromise and that none of them has been declared a proclaimed offender.

Learned State counsel has no objection if the present petition is allowed.

In view of the above, continuation of the proceedings in pursuance of the afore-referred FIR in which offences are not heinous as also the matter having been compromised, would be an abuse of the process of law and in terms of the law laid down by the Supreme Court in *Narinder Singh vs State of Punjab* (2014) 6 SCC 466, this Court deems it just and proper to allow the petition and resultantly quash Rapat No.23 dated 06.03.2022 registered under Sections 326, 323, 506, 201 and 34 IPC in FIR No.21 dated 05.03.2022 registered under Sections 323, 324, 427, 506 and 34 IPC at Police Station Rangar Nangal, Police District Batala and all proceedings arising therefrom qua the petitioners.
