1. Learned counsel for the petitioner has approached this Court by filing criminal writ petition under Article 226/227 of the Constitution of India praying for issuance of a writ in the nature of mandamus directing the respondents No.2 and 3 to protect the life and liberty of the petitioner from the hands of accused, with a further direction to respondents No.4 and 5 to look into the FIR No.125 dated 19.05.2023 registered under Sections 279, 337, 338, 427 IPC at Police Station Sahnewal, Ludhiana.

2. Learned counsel for the petitioner, *inter alia*, contends that on 05.05.2023 around 7 PM when the petitioner was on his way back to Sahnewal on his motor cycle, one tractor trolley came from front side and hit the motor cycle. Due to the collusion, petitioner suffered serious head injuries and the pillion rider also suffered injuries in the said accident. The petitioner had also suffered fracture of his right arm. He was admitted to the Civil Hospital, Ludhiana where surgery was performed on him. It is further contended that after much efforts, police had registered the FIR in question. However, more than six months have passed and till today, no action has been taken by the police.

- 3. Notice of motion to official respondents only.
- 4. On the asking of the Court , Ms. Navreet Kaur, AAG, Punjab, who is present in Court, accepts notice on behalf of the respondent-State and on instructions from ASI Satnam Singh, submits that after completion of the investigation, an untraced report is filed before the concerned jurisdictional Magistrate.
- 5. In view of the aforesaid facts and circumstances, learned counsel for the petitioner wishes to withdraw the present petition with liberty to avail alternative remedy as available to the petitioner in accordance with law.
- 6. Dismissed as withdrawn with liberty as aforesaid.
