The petitioner alleges violation of the direction dated 24.07.2018. The operative part of the said direction, reads as under:-

“After perusing the records and in view of the age of petitioners, who are working in their respective Schools from the last 21 to 35 years and still continuing in services, which are perennial in nature, the present petition is disposed of with a direction to the respondents to regularize the services of petitioner Nos.1 and 3 as per policy (Annexure P-14) as they were fully eligible for regularization on the date of its commencement, within a period of three months from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order.”

The District Education Officer has filed an affidavit along with a letter of regularization of the petitioner dated 08.07.2020.

In compliance of the further direction, an additional affidavit is filed on 09.09.2022, in which it is stated that when the petitioner had joined the respondent/Department as part-time worker on

01.01.1993 and the case of the petitioner was considered for regularization which was as per the seniority list of the part-time worker maintained in the office. The petitioner was at Serial No.210 as per the joining as part-time worker and therefore, the petitioner is found eligible to be regularized as per the seniority list w.e.f. 08.07.2020.

In view of the above, this contempt petition is dismissed.
