The present criminal writ petition has been filed under Article 226 of the Constitution of India for issuance of a writ in the nature of *mandamus* for directing respondents No.2 to 4 to protect the life and liberty of the petitioners and their family members and to restrain the private respondents No.5 to 8 from harassing and interfering in the peaceful life of the petitioners.

Having heard learned counsel for the parties, the learned counsel for the petitioners has raised vague and fanciful apprehensions in the present petition and he has not even approached the concerned jurisdictional police officer. One FIR on the complaint made by the petitioner, has already been registered against respondents No.5 and 6 and now, the petitioner has impleaded their two daughters as respondents No.7 and 8 in this petition.

In view of the above, no ground for interference is made out and thus, the present petition stands dismissed.
