2 29-02-2024 1. The present writ petition has been filed seeking the
following relief(s):-

“1.A) To issue a writ in the nature of Certiorari setting aside the order dated 28.06.2023 (Annexure 3) passed by the District Magistrate, Supaul (Respondent no-4) in Anganwari Appeal Case No- 10/2022 and 19/2022 whereby and whereunder he was pleased to dismiss Anganwari Appeal of Petitioner vide Appeal No- 10/2022 and at the same time allowed the appeal of Private Respondent vide



Appeal No- 19/2022.

B) To issue a writ in the nature of Mandamus, directing and commanding the Respondents to reinstate the Petitioner on the post of Anganwari Sevika.”

2. At the outset, the learned counsel for the petitioner seeks not to press the present writ petition, however, seeks liberty on behalf of the petitioner to avail such other alternative remedies as are otherwise available under the law, including that of filing a suit before the learned Civil Court having competent jurisdiction for redressal of her aforesaid grievances. Liberty so sought is granted.

3. The writ petition stands dismissed as not pressed.
