No doubt, he might have purchased the subject matter of vehicle from Ashraf Ali Mansuri. However, there is no iota of material evidence to the extent that subject matter of motor vehicle stands in the name of the petitioner. Therefore, the present petition is not maintainable.

reserving liberty to Ashraf Ali Mansuri to file writ petition.
