following relief:-

“1. That this is an application for issuance of an appropriate writ/writs, order / orders, direction / directions for commanding the respondents to pay of arrear amount after granting of 1st and 2nd A.C. P (Assured Career Progression) of the husband (Late Pramod Kumar Singh, retired



Hawalدار) of the petitioner which has been dues from 09.08.1999. and other consequential allowances in different heads including retiral benefits amount with interest as given to the employees of State of Jharkhand and to grant any other relief or reliefs for which the petitioner is legally entitled.”

- 2. After some arguments, the learned counsel for the petitioner seeks liberty on behalf of the petitioner to approach the Hon’ble Jharkhand High Court.
- 3. It is needless to state that in case, law permits, the petitioner is free to approach the appropriate Court of competent jurisdiction.
