seeking the following relief:-

*“1. That, this writ petition is for
issuance of an appropriate writ/
writs in nature of MANDAMUS for
commanding and directing
concerned authorities under District
Administration especially the District
Magistrate and Superintendent of
Police, Siwan equally to provide
protection to his life, liberty and
personal property, which are*



constitutional rights guaranteed under Article 21 and Article 300A of the Constitution of India, considering the rights and entitlement upon land till the disposal of Miscellaneous Title Suit No. 118 of 2023 purposes to avoid unnecessary litigations and to protect his fundamental rights and for other necessary relief/ reliefs on the basis of facts and circumstances of the case as stated, enumerated and discussed hereinafter.”

2. At the outset, the learned counsel for the petitioner seeks liberty on behalf of the petitioner to approach the respondent no. 3 i.e. the Superintendent of Police, Siwan for redressal of his aforesaid grievances. Liberty, so sought, is granted.
