4 28-06-2024 The present writ petition has been filed
seeking the following relief:-

“1. That this petition is directed for the issuance of an appropriate writ/s, order/s, direction/s for commanding the respondent's authorities to make payment to the petitioner as per provision of Covid-19 Pandemic Guideline issued from the Govt. of Bihar, in which, there is certain



provision regarding grant of compensation to the deceased family members who had died due to Covid-19 of any member of family Rs. 4,00,000/- as compensation amount may be granted to the concerned family."

2. At the outset, the learned counsel for the respondents submits that a sum of Rs. 4,50,000/- has already been paid to the petitioner on the head of *ex gratia* amount in lieu of death of the father of the petitioner due to COVID-19 infection, hence it is submitted that the present writ petition has been rendered infructuous.

3. The learned counsel for the petitioner submits that if it be so, the present writ petition be disposed off.

4. The writ petition stands disposed off.
