ORAL ORDER

2 09-05-2024 Heard learned counsel for the petitioner and learned
APP for the State.

2. The petitioner seeks bail in Parasi P.S. Case No. 97
of 2023, instituted for the offences punishable under Sections
341, 323, 307, 379/34 of the Indian Penal Code.

3. The prosecution case, in short, is that, petitioner
along with other co-accused persons armed with iron rod
assaulted the husband of the informant on his head due to which
the husband of the informant sustained injury and the petitioner
has also snatched gold chain of the informant.

4. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the
petitioner is innocent and has falsely been implicated in the
present case. Charge-sheet has been submitted in this case. No



incriminating material has been recovered from the conscious possession of the petitioner. It is further submitted that both the parties are neighbour and there is case and counter case between the parties due to admitted land dispute between them. The injury sustained by the husband of the informant is grievous in nature. The petitioner is in custody since 16.11.2023 and has got two criminal antecedents.

5. Learned APP for the State has vehemently opposed the prayer for grant of bail to the petitioner.

6. Considering the aforesaid facts and circumstances of the case and taking into account the period of custody undergone by the petitioner, this Court is inclined to grant bail to the petitioner.

7. Let the petitioner be released on bail on furnishing bail bonds of Rs. 10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand) with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of Court below/concerned Court in connection with Parasi P.S. Case No. 97 of 2023, subject to the following conditions:

(I) One of the bailors shall be own/close member of the family of the petitioner.

(II) The petitioner shall appear on each and every date fixed at the trial. In case of default in such appearance on two



consecutive dates, the Trial Court will have liberty to cancel the bail bonds of the petitioner.

(III) If the petitioner is found involved in similar nature of offence in future, the Trial Court will have the liberty to cancel the bail bonds of the petitioner.
