*"1. That this is an application for
issuance of writ in the nature of
Mandamus and/or any other appropriate
writ / writs, order / orders, direction /
directions for (i) commanding upon the

order dated 16.12.2022 and 20.01.2023 passed by the Sub-Divisional Officer, (ii) to provide security to the petitioners to reside in the house peacefully, which is constructed on 15 dhur ancestral land and 10 dhur purchased land of the petitioners and/or (iii) any other relief your Lordships may deem fit and proper.”
