2. The present writ petition has been preferred for the

following reliefs:

*(i) for a direction upon the respondents
to stop the work of construction on the private land
of petitioner pertaining to plot no.173(old)
423(new), khata no. 45(old) 124(new), Thana no.
169, Mauza Banda, in the village Banda and*



removed the illegal encroachment from aforesaid ancestral land of the petitioner;

(ii) for restraining the Respondent no. 6 and 7 from further encroaching the land of petitioner related to plot no. 173(old) 423(new) of Banda village;

(iii) for any other writ or writs and/or order or orders or/and direction or directions as this Hon'ble Court deem fit and proper in law and equity and costs of and incidental to thereto.

3. How the State comes into picture in the dispute between the petitioner and the private persons (respondent nos. 6 and 7) which prompted him to prefer writ petition.

4. The remedy lies before the competent civil Court as also under different sections of the Cr.P.C.

5. The writ petition stands disposed of.
