petitioner herein is concerned, the benefits, required to be given to the petitioner, has already been given, as is apparent from the supplementary show cause, filed on behalf of the opposite parties no. 2 and 3, inasmuch as a sum of Rs. 14, 99, 805/- has stood paid to the petitioner.

2. In view of the aforesaid, the learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner be granted liberty to avail such other alternative remedies as are otherwise available under the law in case of any subsisting grievances. Liberty, so sought, is granted.
