ORAL ORDER

3 20-11-2024 Heard learned counsels for the parties.

2. The petitioners apprehends their arrest in a case registered for the offence punishable under Sections 341, 323, 504, 506, 308, 379/34 of the Indian Penal Code.

3. As per the FIR, when the informant demanded wages of her husband from the petitioner no.1, then the petitioners and other co-accused persons abused her and also assaulted the informant's side.

4. It is submitted by learned counsel for the petitioners that petitioners are quite innocent and have committed no offence.



They have been falsely implicated in this case due to previous enmity. No such occurrence, in the manner as alleged, has ever taken place. The allegation levelled against the petitioners is not specific rather general and omnibus in nature. It is further submitted that for the alleged occurrence, there is a case and counter case between the parties and both sides have sustained simple injuries. Petitioners have no criminal antecedent.

5. Learned APP for the State as well as learned counsel for the informant opposed the prayer for anticipatory bail.

6. Having regard to the facts and circumstances of the case, let the above named petitioners, be released on bail, in the event of their arrest or surrender before the learned Court below within a period of six weeks from today, on furnishing bail bond of Rs. 25,000/- (Rupees Twenty Five Thousand) **each** with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned court below where the case is pending/Successor Court in connection with Rajoun P.S. Case No.123 of 2024, subject to the conditions as laid down under Section 438(2) of the Cr.P.C.
