seeking the following relief:-

*“1. That this is an application for
issuance of an appropriate writ in the
nature of Mandamus directing the
Respondents No. 4 and 5 to restrain
them from installing Electric Tower*



Grid, Electric Pole, crossing of wire etc. upon the lands of the petitioners situated at Village Ashok Nagar and Borarald under Chandpur Bhangha Panchayat, District-Purnea and any other appropriate writ, order, direction save and except in accordance with law.”

2. At the outset, the learned counsel for the petitioners seeks not to press the present writ petition in view of the judgment rendered by the Hon’ble Apex Court in the case of **Power Grid Corporation of India Limited vs. Century Textile & Industries Limited**, reported in **(2017)5 SCC 143**, however, seeks liberty on behalf of the petitioners to approach the competent Authority/Court for grant of compensation. Liberty, so sought, is granted.
3. The writ petition stands disposed off as not pressed.
