learned A.P.P. for the State along with learned counsel for the
OP No. 2.

2. The petitioner apprehends his arrest in a case
registered for the offences punishable under Sections 323, 341,
498A and 504 of the Indian Penal Code and Section 4 of D.P.
Act.

3. Learned counsels for the parties jointly submit that
the case was referred for mediation and the mediation
succeeded.

4. Learned counsel, Mr Ravi Prakash Diwedi,
appearing on behalf of OP No. 2 submits that he has instruction



to make submission not to oppose the anticipatory bail application of the petitioner.

Considering the submissions made by the learned counsel for the OP No. 2, the petitioner above-named, in the event of his arrest or surrender before the learned trial court within a period of six weeks from today, be released on anticipatory bail on furnishing bail bonds of Rs. 2,000/- (Rupees Two Thousand) with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned trial court where the case is pending/successor court in connection with Complaint Case No. 1624 of 2022 subject to the conditions as laid down under Section 438 (2) of the Cr.P.C.
