ORAL ORDER

3 21-11-2024 Heard learned counsel for the petitioner and learned
APP for the State.

2. The petitioner seeks bail in connection with
Sessions Trial No. 512 of 2024 arising out of Paraiya P.S. Case
No. 34 of 2024 instituted for the offences under Section 306 of
the Indian Penal Code.

3. Prosecution case, in short, is that the informant's
son and his daughter-in-law committed suicide by administering
poison to themselves in anger caused by the petitioner.

4. Learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that the
petitioner has falsely been implicated in the present case.
Learned counsel further submitted that there is no role available
in the case diary to prove that this petitioner instigated the



deceased persons to commit suicide. Learned counsel further submitted that there is a delay of two days in lodging the FIR without any plausible explanation, which in itself, raises doubt over the prosecution story. It has been submitted on behalf of the petitioner that the petitioner is in custody since 25.01.2024 and has no criminal antecedent.

5. Learned A.P.P. for the State has vehemently opposed the prayer for grant of bail to the petitioner. Learned counsel further submitted that this petitioner sent a video to the deceased persons on the mobile phone due to which they committed suicide and, therefore, the role of the petitioner in the commission of alleged offence cannot be ruled out.

6. Considering the aforesaid facts and circumstances of the case as also the period of custody undergone by the petitioner, this Court is inclined to grant bail to the petitioner.

7. Let the petitioner be released on bail on furnishing bail bonds of Rs.10,000/- (Ten thousand) with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of Court below/concerned Court in connection with Sessions Trial No. 512 of 2024 arising out of Paraiya P.S. Case No. 34 of 2024, subject to the following conditions:

(I) One of the bailors shall be own/close member of



the family of the petitioner.

(II) The petitioner shall appear on each and every date fixed at the trial. In case of default in such appearance on two consecutive dates, the Trial Court will have liberty to cancel the bail bonds of the petitioner.
