2 30-10-2024 Heard learned counsel for the petitioners and learned Additional Public Prosecutor for the State.

2. The petitioners apprehend their arrest in a case registered for the offence punishable u/s 126(2), 118(1), 109, 352, 3(5), 117(2) of B.N.S.

3. Allegation against the petitioners is that they along with other accused persons armed with *lathi*, *danda* and rod are said to have assaulted the informant and others.

4. It is submitted by learned counsel for the petitioners that petitioners are quite innocent and have committed no offence. They have been falsely implicated in this case due to enmity and



village politics. No such occurrence, in the manner as alleged, has taken place. There is no specific allegation against the petitioners rather the allegation is general and omnibus. It is submitted that there is delay in lodging the FIR. The petitioners and informant are co-villagers. There are no independent witnesses who has supported the prosecution case. The petitioners have clean antecedent as mentioned in para 3 of the bail application.

5. Learned APP for the State and learned counsel for the informant opposed the prayer for bail.

6. Having regard to the facts and circumstances of the case and since no specific overt act attributed against the petitioners, let the above named petitioners, be released on bail, in the event of their arrest or surrender before the learned Court below within a period of six weeks from today, on furnishing bail bond of Rs. 25,000/- (Rupees Twenty Five Thousand) each with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned court below where the case is pending/Successor Court in connection with Mahindwara P.S. Case No.96 of 2024, subject to the conditions as laid down under Section 482(2) of BNSS, 2023.
