ORAL ORDER

- 2 22-04-2024 At the outset, the learned counsel for the petitioner seeks permission to correct the nomenclature of respondent no. 2. Permission, so sought, is granted.

3. The present writ petition has been filed seeking the following relief:-

“1.(i) For issuance of a writ of Mandamus or any other appropriate writ, order or direction commanding the respondent authority for



payment of due amount Rs. 3,27,847.00 Transport expense which was made in carriage of food grain to the petitioner which was made in advance by the petitioner in capacity of Assistant Manager, Bihar State Food & Civil Supplies Corporation."

4. At the outset, the learned counsel for the petitioner seeks liberty on behalf of the petitioner to approach the Chief General Manager, Transport, Bihar State Food & Civil Supplies Corporation Ltd., Govt. of Bihar, Patna i.e. the respondent no. 2, for redressal of his aforesaid grievances. Liberty, so sought, is granted.

It is needless to state that in case the petitioner approaches the Chief General Manager, Transport, Bihar State Food & Civil Supplies Corporation Ltd., Govt. of Bihar, Patna i.e. the respondent no. 2, by filing appropriate representation, within a period of two weeks from today, the same shall be disposed off by a reasoned and a speaking order, in accordance with law, within a period of six weeks, thereafter.
