ORAL ORDER

2 20-04-2024 The present writ petition has been filed
seeking the following reliefs:-

“1. i)To set aside the order dated 22.09.2023 passed by the Divisional Commissioner, Munger in Anganbari Sewa Appeal No. 16 of 2023 (Smt. Parvati Kumari versus Bibha Kumari) allowing the said appeal and the order to District Programme Officer, (ICDS), Begusarai vide Memo No. 251 dated 01.03.2023 has been cancelled and the decision



of Aam Sabha dated 23.12.2020 has been restored by the order impugned without considering the whole facts and circumstances of the case only on the basis of conjecture and surmises.

ii) Petitioner selection as Anganbari Sevika at Anganbari Centre no.72 Ward No. 8 Gram Panchayat Gobindpur 01, village Temuhan, Block Mansoor Chak, District-Begusarai may be restored and if the respondent no.6 i.e. Smt. Parvati Kumari selected after the order impugned, may be cancelled with immediate effect.

iii) And further be pleased to stay the operation of order impugned till the disposal of this petition."

2. At the outset, the learned counsel for the petitioner seeks not to press the present writ petition, however, seeks liberty on behalf of the petitioner to avail such other alternative remedies as are otherwise available under the law, including that of filing a suit before the Ld. Civil Court having competent jurisdiction, for redressal of the aforesaid grievances. Liberty, so sought, is



granted.

3. The writ petition stands dismissed as not pressed.
