A.P.P. for the State.

2. The petitioner apprehends his arrest in a case registered for the offences punishable under Section 414 of the Indian Penal Code and Section 30(a) of the Bihar Prohibition and Excise Amended Act, 2018.

3. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that petitioner is innocent and has been falsely implicated in this case. He submits that there is no recovery from the conscious possession of the petitioner rather 72 litres of Nepali liquor is said to have recovered from two motorcycles. He submits that the petitioner is owner of the seized motorcycle. He further submits that the motorcycle of the petitioner had been theft in the year 2020 and the Sanha with regard to theft of the Vehicle has been given to the Bhutahi PS and the receiving with regard



to Sanha has not been provided to the petitioner and no F.I.R. was registered by the Bhutahi PS and after two years, the motorcycle in question was recovered carrying illicit liquor and on that basis the petitioner has been made accused in the present case. The petitioner has no criminal antecedent as stated in para-3 of the bail application.

4. Petitioner is agreed to deposit a sum of Rs.5,000/- (Rupees Five Thousand) in Mahavir Cancer Sansthan, Patna, bearing Account No.3332964762, IFSC Code: CBIN0282779, Central Bank of India, Chitkohra Branch, Patna.

5. Having regard to the facts and circumstances of the case and the fact that there is nothing recovered from the conscious possession of the petitioner, let the above named petitioner, be released on bail, in the event of his arrest or surrender before the learned Court below within a period of eight weeks from today, on furnishing bail bond of Rs. 25,000/- (Rupees Twenty Five Thousand) with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned Court below where the case is pending/successor Court in connection with Riga P.S. Case No.461 of 2022, subject to the condition as laid down under Section 482 (2) of the B.N.S.S., subject to the further conditions that:



(1) That one of the bailors will be a close relative of the petitioner, who will give an affidavit giving genealogy as to how he is related with the petitioner. He will also undertake to inform the Court if there is any change in the address of the petitioner.

(2) That the bailor shall also state on affidavit that he will inform the Court concerned if the petitioner is implicated in any other case of similar nature after his release in the present case and thereafter the Court below will be at liberty to initiate proceeding for cancellation of bail on the ground of misuse.

6. The bail bond of the petitioner shall be accepted by the learned Court below on showing receipt of deposit of the aforesaid amount in the account of Mahavir Cancer Sansthan, Patna.

7. However, the learned Court below is directed to verify the criminal antecedent of the petitioner before accepting the bail bonds. If it is found that the petitioner is involved in any other case prior to the present case his bail bonds shall not be accepted.
