Petitioner before us prays for cancellation of the order dated December 11, 2023 passed in Criminal Misc. Case No. 3525 of 2023 granting anticipatory bail to the private opposite parties.

Learned advocate appearing for the petitioner submits that subsequent to the grant of such order, the private opposite parties threatened the petitioner.

Learned advocate appearing for the State refers to the materials in the case diary.

Private opposite parties are represented.

Apparently, there was an incident of assault where, four persons suffered injuries. None of the injuries were classified as grievous hurt.

Jurisdictional Court granted anticipatory bail to the private opposite parties on the finding that the materials in the case diary do not suggest requirement of custodial interrogation of the private opposite parties.

We do not find any infirmity in such finding of the learned trial Judge.

So far as the subsequent treat is concerned, apparently, police registered a case which culminating in a proceeding under Sections 107/116(3) of the Criminal Procedure Code.

Police reports that there is no further altercation at the locality.

In such circumstances, we find no merits in the present application.

CRM (DB) 661 of 2024 is **dismissed** without any order as to costs.
