C.R.M.(A) 851 of 2024

In Re:- An application for anticipatory bail under Section 438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure in connection with **Bagdah** Police Station Case No. **799** of **2023** dated **07.10.2023** under Sections **498A/406/325/307/506/34** of the Indian Penal Code, 1860.

And

In the matter of : Uttam Ghosh & anr.

Petitioners pray for anticipatory bail.

Husband surrendered and obtained bail from the jurisdictional Court.

Petitioners before us are father-in-law and brother-in-law of the de facto complainant.

Apparently, the injury suffered was classified as simple hurt.

Materials in the Case Diary does not require custodial interrogation of the petitioners.

In such circumstances, we grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners.

Accordingly, we direct that in the event of arrest the petitioners shall be released on bail upon furnishing a bond of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) each, with two sureties of like amount each, to the satisfaction of the arresting

officer and also be subject to the conditions as laid down under Section 438(2) of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 and on further condition that the petitioners will report before the Investigating Officer once in a week till the conclusion of investigation and on condition that the petitioners shall appear on every date before the jurisdictional Court on and from the date fixed for appearance of the accused and in default the jurisdictional Court will pass appropriate order to secure the presence of the petitioners in Court including cancelling the anticipatory bail granted without further reference to this Court.

This application for anticipatory bail is, thus, allowed.

CRM(A) 851 of 2024 is disposed of.
