1. Petitioner prays for anticipatory bail.
2. Learned lawyer for the State opposes the prayer of anticipatory bail.
3. We have considered the materials on record. No incriminating article was recovered from the petitioner. Investigation is complete. Accordingly, we are inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner.
4. Accordingly, we direct that in the event of arrest the petitioner, namely, Pintu Sk alias Sekh shall be released on bail upon furnishing a bond of Rs.10,000/-

with two sureties of like amount each, to the satisfaction of the arresting officer and also be subject to the conditions as laid down under Section 438(2) of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 and on condition that he shall appear before the court below and pray for regular bail within a period of four weeks from date.

5. The application for anticipatory bail is, thus, allowed.
