Affidavit-of-service filed on behalf of the petitioner, is taken on record.

The petitioner is a retired Assistant Headmaster who superannuated on 30th November, 2018. After superannuation of the petitioner, First Pension Payment Order was issued on 26th November, 2018 and as per the First Pension Payment Order, disbursement of retiral dues was made in favour of the petitioner. Subsequently, due to revision of pay as per ROPA 2019, Revised Pension Payment Order was issued on 29th September, 2020. The petitioner claims interest on revised gratuity as per revised Pension Payment Order.

The State respondents are represented by learned advocate.

Accordingly, the Director of Pension, Provident Fund and Group Insurance and the concerned

Treasury Officer are directed to pay interest at the rate of 8 % per annum to the petitioner on the revised gratuity as per Revised Pension Payment Order from 14th February, 2020 till the date of actual disbursement of revised gratuity amount in favour of the petitioner, within a period of eight weeks from the date of this order.

Since no affidavit has been called for, the allegations contained in the writ petition are deemed not to have been admitted.

With the above observation, the writ petition stands disposed of.

There shall be no order as to costs.
