The matter is appearing in the list marked as 'Last Chance'. The matter was initially placed in the list by the department. It is appearing in the list for a considerable period of time and has been also called on regular basis. When no one has appeared either in support of the application or to oppose the same as a consequence whereof the matter was placed in the list under the heading 'Second Chance'. more interested to prosecute the same.

In the aforesaid facts and circumstances, the writ petition is disposed of without passing any order.
