C.R.M.(A) 1491 of 2024

In Re:- An application for anticipatory bail under Section 438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure in connection with **Techno City** Police Station Case No. **59 of 2024** dated **18.04.2024** under Sections **341/325/326/307/506/34** of the Indian Penal Code, 1860, pending before the Court of the Learned Chief Judicial Magistrate, Barasat.

Two persons were injured in the incident of assault.

None of the injuries were classified as grievous hurt.

One person suffered moderate mild tenderness on head, abrasion on the lower elbow and bruises on the right eye, while other suffered superficial lacerated wound over the right and mild moderate tenderness on the lower back.

Considering the nature of the incident and the involvement of the petitioners therein, we grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners.

Accordingly, we direct that in the event of arrest the petitioners shall be released on bail upon furnishing a bond of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) each, with two sureties of like amount each, to the satisfaction of the arresting officer and also be subject to the conditions as laid down under Section 438(2) of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 and on further condition that the petitioners will report before the Investigating Officer once in a week till the conclusion of investigation and on condition that the petitioners shall appear on every date before the jurisdictional Court on and from the date fixed for appearance of the accused and in default the jurisdictional Court will pass appropriate order to secure the presence of the petitioners in Court including cancelling the anticipatory bail granted without further reference to this Court.

This application for anticipatory bail is, thus, allowed.

CRM(A) 1491 of 2024 is disposed of.
