In Re: An application for anticipatory bail under Section 438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure read with Section 482 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023 in connection with Murutia Police Station Case No. 288 of 2024 dated 22.09.2024 under Sections 126(2)/117/118(2)/109/3(5) of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023.

1. Petitioner submits they have been falsely implicated roped in the case. They pray for anticipatory bail.

2. Learned lawyer for the State opposes the prayer for anticipatory bail.

3. We have considered the materials on record including the injury reports. City scan does not reveal internal fracture or brain injury. Other injuries also do not appear to be grievous.

4. In view of the aforesaid facts, we are inclined to grant anticipatory bail.

5. Accordingly, we direct that in the event of arrest, the petitioners viz., **(1) Sanjoy Das** and **(2) Samrat Das** be released on bail upon furnishing a bond of Rs.10,000/-, with two sureties of like amount each, to the satisfaction of the Arresting Officer and also subject to the conditions as laid down under Section

482(2) of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023. They shall appear before the jurisdictional court and pray for regular bail within four weeks from date.

6. The application for anticipatory bail is, thus, disposed of.
