It appears from the representation of the petitioner that he is aggrieved with the private respondents coming inside his room with shoes on and without a mask. It is also alleged that she would quarrel with all and create a ruckus.

I do not consider these to be a serious infringement of a person's liberty or right to life that needs correction by the State.

This is hardly a matter where this Court would intervene in a writ petition, that too for police inaction.

Therefore, the writ petition is dismissed.

However, there shall be no order as to costs..
