Affidavit of service is taken on record.

The wife of the petitioner was an approved Assistant Teacher of a High School, District-Darjeeling, who retired from service on 30.11.2010. The second Pension Payment Order was issued on 16.10.2023 after the petitioner's wife refunded the government's contribution upon switching over from the CPF to GPF. The petitioner received the arrear pension on 31.10.2023. The wife of the petitioner died on 27.08.2023.

The grievance of the petitioner is that interest on the delayed payment of arrear pension has not been paid.

It is now settled law that pension and gratuity amount is to be released to the retired employee immediately upon retirement and in case of delay in releasing the pension and gratuity amount, the retired employee is entitled to get interest.

Similar orders have already been passed by this Court, by which families of employees, who died, were granted interest for delayed payment of gratuity and arrear pension.

It is settled law that the family of an employee has the right to receive the death benefits urgently. It is a valuable right and non-payment would attract interest.

The Director of Pension, Provident Fund & Group Insurance, Government of West Bengal as also the concerned Treasury Officer are directed to pay interest @ 8% per annum on the arrear pension amount from the date of entitlement till the actual date of disbursement.

Such payment is to be made within three months from the date of communication of the certified copy of this order to the concerned authorities.

Needless to mention, before any such disbursement is made, the disbursing authority shall satisfy himself about the genuineness of the claim and verify the signature and identity of the claimant who has approached this court.

With the aforesaid observation and directions, this writ application stands disposed of.

There will, however, be no order as to costs.
