PER COURT :-

1. The learned Advocate for the Petitioner fairly submits that after this Petition was filed for challenging the enquiry and the dismissal order, the Petitioner has preferred a departmental appeal under Rule 49 of Maharashtra Gramin Bank (Officers and Employees) Service Regulations, 2010. He, therefore, prays that the Competent Committee be directed to decide the appeal expeditiously.

2. The learned Advocate Mr. Shahane appearing on behalf of Respondent No.2, submits that the appeal is filed on 27th April, 2024. This matter is taken up today on 29th April, 2024. This appeal will have to be placed on the agenda before the Board, by following the due procedure laid down in law. It may take around 90 days to decide the

said appeal.
