1. Both the counsel jointly submit that the parties have reached into an amicable settlement and have accordingly entered into consent terms dated 1 April 2024, the same is tendered in Court. It is taken on record and marked “X” for identification. The consent terms has been signed by the authorised signatory of Petitioner, respondent and their respective advocates. Mr. Page and Mr. Patil state that the signatories are present in Court and they identify their respective client.

2. Order in terms of the consent terms. All statements made in consent terms are accepted as undertaking to this Court. All undertakings are also accepted.

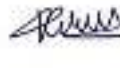

CONSENT TERMS

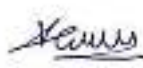
The Petitioner and Respondent have mutually and amicably resolved their disputes and have agreed to settle the same by entering into the present Consent Terms on the following conditions:

1. The marriage between the Petitioner and Respondent was solemnised under Hindu Law on 24/02/2019. Due to differences, the Petitioner and the Respondent have been residing separately since 14/04/2019. The Petitioner applied for Dissolution of marriage by passing Decree on the ground of Nullity u/s. 12 (1) (c) of Hindu Marriage Act, 1956 by preferring Marriage Petition No. 1074 of 2019 before the Court of Civil Judge Senior Division at Pune which is pending. The Petitioner and the Respondent agree to dissolve their marriage by seeking a Decree of Divorce by Mutual Consent. For the said purpose, the Petitioner and the Respondent agree to apply jointly in the said pending Marriage Petition No. 1074 of 2019 for converting the same to a Petition for Divorce by Mutual Consent u/s/ 13 B of the Hindu Marriage Act, 1956 within 2 weeks from the date of the Order passed in the present Writ Petition. The Ld. Civil Judge Senior Division Pune before whom the joint Petition is filed to consider and grant the same

taking into account the period of separation being from 14/04/2019 i.e. 4 years 11 months 19 days till today.

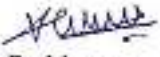
2. By way of Permanent Alimony, the Petitioner shall pay a sum of Rs. 8,00,000/- to the Respondent. The payment of sum of Rs. 8,00,000/- by the Petitioner to the Respondent shall be by way of deposit of the said amount by Cheque along with the Joint Petition for Divorce by Mutual Consent before the Civil Judge Senior Division Pune and the Respondent shall be entitled to withdraw the said amount on pronouncement of Judgment.
3. The Petitioner shall hand over / return to the Respondent, her Streedhan i.e. 1 Gold Chain of approximate weight of 6 to 10 grams before the Court of Civil Judge Senior Division Pune on pronouncement of Judgment.
4. The Respondent shall withdraw the RCC No. 470 of 2024 (Criminal M.A. No.3234 of 2021 [old]) pending before JMFC Nagpur against the Petitioner and his Mother (Mrs. Anjali Sanjiv Deshpande), on preferring the Joint Petition for Divorce by Mutual Consent.
5. Both parties agree that they have not filed any other cases against each other and pending cases if any, shall be withdrawn forthwith.
6. Both parties agree that the allegations made against each other stand withdrawn and not to initiate any further proceedings against each other and/or contact each other except for obtaining the Decree for Divorce and /or withdrawal / quashing of RCC No. 470 of 2024 (Criminal M.A. No.3234 of 2021 [old]) pending before JMFC Nagpur.

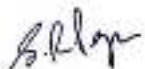
7. Both parties agree not to make any claims against each other and/or claim any right and/or share in each other's properties.
8. Both parties agree that aforesaid terms be treated as the undertakings of the Petitioner and Respondent to this Hon'ble Court and to abide by the same.
9. The present Writ Petition be disposed off in terms of the present consent terms.

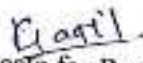
