1. The Petitioner's father passed away on 8th September, 2006. The widow moved an application on 14th March, 2006 for compassionate appointment. On 3rd September, 2007, the widow changed her mind and moved an affidavit seeking appointment of the Petitioner on compassionate basis, when he was only 12 years old. Apparently, the application was not maintainable. The resultant effect is that the widow did not take the appointment on
