1. We have heard Mr. Kumar, learned counsel for the Applicant/revenue and Ms. Ms. Jasmin Amalsadwala, learned counsel for the Respondent.

2. By this application, the applicant has prayed for condonation of delay of 95 days in filing the aforesaid appeal under the provisions of Section 260A of the Income Tax Act, 1961.
