2. The applicant is seeking condonation of delay of 65 days caused in preferring revision application.
3. The contention is that the applicants are in jail from the date of appeal and therefore they could not contact their family members hence delay occurred.
4. For the reasons mentioned in the application coupled with the fact that appeal is a statutory right, delay of 65 days in preferring revision application stands condoned.
5. Registry to register revision application. The application stands disposed of.

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6. The revision application challenges judgment and order dated 22.10.2013 by the learned Judicial Magistrate First

Class, Sangrampur, District Buldhana in Regular Criminal Case no.310/2010 and confirmed by the learned Additional Sessions Judge, Khamgaon, District Buldhana by judgment and order dated 13.09.2023 in Criminal Appeal No.16/2013, whereby applicants have been convicted for the offence punishable under sections 326, 452 read with section 34 of the Indian Penal Code.
