1. Heard the learned counsel for applicant/appellant as well as learned counsel for non-applicants.
2. On perusal of the application for condonation of delay, it appears that the delay of 454 and 394 days is caused in preferring the application for bringing the legal representatives of the deceased appellant on record and application for setting aside the abatement.
