3. The parties are present before this Court. They reiterated to have settled the dispute in terms of the consent terms. The consent terms are signed by the parties and their Advocate.

4. The petition is disposed of, in terms of consent terms.

In terms of consent terms, if the petition for divorce by mutual consent is filed, then considering the facts and circumstances of the case, the concerned Court shall waive the statutory period of six months specified under Section 13B (2) of the Hindu Marriage Act, 1955, if the application to that effect is made.
