This is an application for condonation of 20 days delay in filing the appeal against the impugned judgment and order dated 14.06.2024, passed by the learned Extra Joint District Judge and Additional Sessions Judge, Nagpur. The appellant/accused has been sentenced to suffer rigorous imprisonment for twenty years and to pay a

fine of Rs.500/- and suffer rigorous imprisonment for a period of five years and to pay a fine of Rs.300/-, for the offences punishable under Sections 6 and 10 of the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences Act, 2012 respectively. The appellant/accused has been further sentenced to suffer rigorous imprisonment for a period of two years and to pay a fine of Rs.100/-, for the offence punishable under Section 506 of the Indian Penal Code.

5. In view of the facts stated in the application, the application is allowed. The delay of 20 days caused in filing the appeal is condoned.

6. The appeal be registered.

7. The application stands disposed of accordingly.
