



Crl.O.P.No.4683 of 2024

The petitioners seek anticipatory bail in Crime No.30 of 2022, registered by the respondent police for the offences punishable under Sections 419, 423, 467, 471 of IPC.

2. The case of the prosecution is that the petitioners along with the other accused cancelled the sale agreement entered into infavour of the son of the defacto complainant without his knowledge and executes the document in favour of one Thamaraikannan, who is a relative of accused family. The entire incident took place in the year 2008.

3. Taking all these factors into consideration, I am inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners subject to the following conditions:

4. Accordingly, the petitioners are ordered to be released on anticipatory bail in the event of arrest or on their appearance, within a



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period of fifteen days from the date on which the order copy made ready, before the **learned Judge, Anti Land Grabbing Special Court, Cuddalore**, on condition that the petitioners shall execute separate bond for a sum of **Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only)** with two sureties for a like sum to the satisfaction of the respondent police or the police officer who intends to arrest or to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned, failing which, the petition for anticipatory bail shall stand dismissed and on further condition that:

[a] the petitioners and the sureties shall affix their photographs and Left Thumb Impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhar card or Bank pass Book to ensure their identity.

[b] the petitioners shall report before the respondent police everyday at 10.30 a.m., for a period of two weeks and thereafter, as and when required for interrogation.

[c] the petitioners shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial.

[d] the petitioners shall not abscond either during investigation or trial.

[e] On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the



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petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in **P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005)AIR SCW 5560]**.

[f] If the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 229A IPC.
