PRAYER: Criminal Original Petition is filed under Section 439 of Cr.P.C. praying to enlarge the petitioner on bail in Crime No.111 of 2024 on the file of the respondent Police.

ORDER

The petitioner/A1 who was arrested and remanded to judicial custody on 31.01.2024 for the offences originally registered by the



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respondent Police under Sections 294(b), 364, 506(ii) of IPC and later altered to Sections 120B, 147, 148, 294(b), 364, 307 and 506(ii) of IPC in Crime No.111 of 2024, seeks bail.

2.The case of the prosecution is that the petitioner had invested a sum of Rs.5,00,000/- worth about bitcoins with the defacto complainant and the son of the defacto complainant had returned back Rs.1,50,000/- worth of bitcoins. There was a dispute regarding the business of amount repayable by the defacto complainant, for which, all the accused kidnapped the son of the defacto complainant in a car and caused injuries to him. Thereafter, he was left out.

3.The learned counsel for the petitioner stated that all the accused had come under judicial process except A6 who is still absconding.

4.Taking all the factors into consideration and the period of incarceration, this Court is inclined to grant bail to the petitioner subject to the following conditions:

5.Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail on executing a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) each with two sureties, each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the



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learned Judicial Magistrate, Thiruttani and on further conditions that :-

[a] the sureties shall affix their photographs and Left Thumb Impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhar card or Bank pass Book to ensure their identity.

[b] the petitioner shall report before the respondent Police, everyday at 10.30 a.m., until further orders.

[c] the petitioner shall not abscond either during investigation or trial.

[d] the petitioner shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial.

[e] On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005)AIR SCW 5560].

[f] If the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 229A IPC.
