**PRAYER :** Petition filed under Article 226 of the Constitution of India praying for the issuance of a writ of mandamus to direct the first and second respondents to order the constitution of a fact-finding Committee by the first/second respondents on the misdeeds financial irregularities and Wakf Act violations, etc., Committee by the fourth respondent and to elect a new committee by secret ballot for the fourth respondent as per proforma of the wakf and thereby, regularise the affairs of the Wakf under the Wakf Act, 1955, based on the representation dated 3/3/2019, 3/6/2019 and 22/7/2019.

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**ORDER**

This writ petition has been filed to direct the first and second respondents to consider the representations of the petitioner dated 3/3/2019, 3/6/2019 and 22/7/2019.

2.In view of the consent expressed by the Learned counsel appearing for either side, this petition is taken up for final disposal.

3. The case of the petitioner is that the fourth respondent is looting the



wakf properties. Hence representations were submitted to the first and second respondents on 3/3/2019, 3/6/2019 and 22/7/2019. Since, there was no response, petitioner has come forward with the present writ petition.

4. Though very many grounds have been raised, learned counsel for the petitioner submits that it would suffice if this Court issues direction to the first and second respondents to consider the petitioner's representations dated 3/3/2019, 3/6/2019 and 22/7/2019. and pass orders on the same within a particular time frame fixed by this Court.

5. The learned counsel appearing for the respondents 1 to 3 has no objection for said order being passed and he fairly conceded that the petitioner's representations dated 3/3/2019, 3/6/2019 and 22/7/2019 will be considered and appropriate orders will be passed within the time stipulated by this Court.

6. In view of the aforesaid submissions, this Court without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case directs the first respondent to consider the petitioner's representations dated 3/3/2019, 3/6/2019 and 22/7/2019 on

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merits and in accordance with law and pass appropriate orders, within a  
period of twelve weeks from the date of receipt of a copy of this order.
