



Crl.O.P.No.6272 of 2024

The petitioner seeks anticipatory bail in Crime No.100 of 2024 registered by the respondent Police for the offences punishable under Sections 4(1)(a), 4(1)(i), 4(1)(k), 4(1-A), TN Prohibition Act, 24(1) Cigarette and other Tobacco Products Acts 2003, Section 9(ii) of TN Prohibition of Smoking and Spitting Act, 2003, Section 328 of IPC and Section 77 of the Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Act, 2015.

2. It is stated that the accused were found in possession of 28 bottles of liquor and 26 grams of banned tobacco products.

3. However, taking all the other factors into consideration and that there are no previous cases as against the petitioner herein, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner with certain conditions. Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or on their appearance, within a period of fifteen days from the date on which the order copy made ready, before the **learned X Metropolitan**



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Magistrate Court, Egmore, on condition that the petitioner shall execute a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) with two sureties for a like sum to the satisfaction of the respondent police or the police officer who intends to arrest or to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned, failing which, the petition for anticipatory bail shall stand dismissed and on further condition that:

[a] the petitioner and the sureties shall affix their photographs and Left Thumb Impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhar card or Bank pass Book to ensure their identity.

[b] the petitioner shall report before the respondent police everyday at 10.30 a.m., for a period of two weeks and thereafter, as and when required for interrogation.

[c] the petitioner shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial.

[d] the petitioner shall not abscond either during investigation or trial.



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[e] On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioners released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in **P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005)AIR SCW 5560]**.

[f] If the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 229A IPC.
