ORDER

The petitioner who was remanded to judicial custody on 06.03.2024 for the offences registered by the respondent Police under Sections 430 and 379 of IPC r/w 21(1) of Mines and Minerals

(Development and Regulation) Act, 1957, in Crime No.165 of 2024 seeks bail.

2. The case of the prosecution is that the petitioner was alleged to have transported 4 units of sand by using lorry bearing registration No.TN 20 BM 5577.

3.The learned Government Advocate (Crl. Side) for the respondent stated that A2 is the owner of the lorry, who is still absconding.

4. In order to curb illegal sand mining activities, this Court is of the opinion that the petitioner is directed to deposit a sum of Rs.20,000/- (Rupees Twenty Thousand only) as non refundable deposit to the credit of the **District Revenue Officer, Kanchipuram District**, without prejudice to his rights and contentions before the trial Court.

5. Merely, because the petitioner deposits the said amount, it would not amount to admission of his guilt. Therefore, it is open to the trial Court to deal with the case independently.

6. Taking into consideration all other factors and also considering the period of incarceration, this Court is inclined to grant bail to the petitioners subject to the following conditions:

7. Accordingly, the petitioner shall make a non-refundable deposit

of Rs.20,000/- (Rupees Twenty Thousand only) to the credit of the District Revenue Officer, Kanchipuram District and on such deposit and production of proof, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail on his executing a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) each with two sureties, each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned Judicial Magistrate, Sriperumbudur and on further conditions that :-

[a] the sureties shall affix their photographs and Left Thumb Impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhar card or Bank pass Book to ensure their identity.

[b] the petitioner shall report before the respondent Police everyday at 10.30 a.m., for a period of two weeks and thereafter, as and when required for interrogation.

[c] the petitioner shall not abscond either during investigation or trial.

[d] the petitioner shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial.

[e] On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial

Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005)AIR SCW 5560].

[f] If the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 229A IPC.
